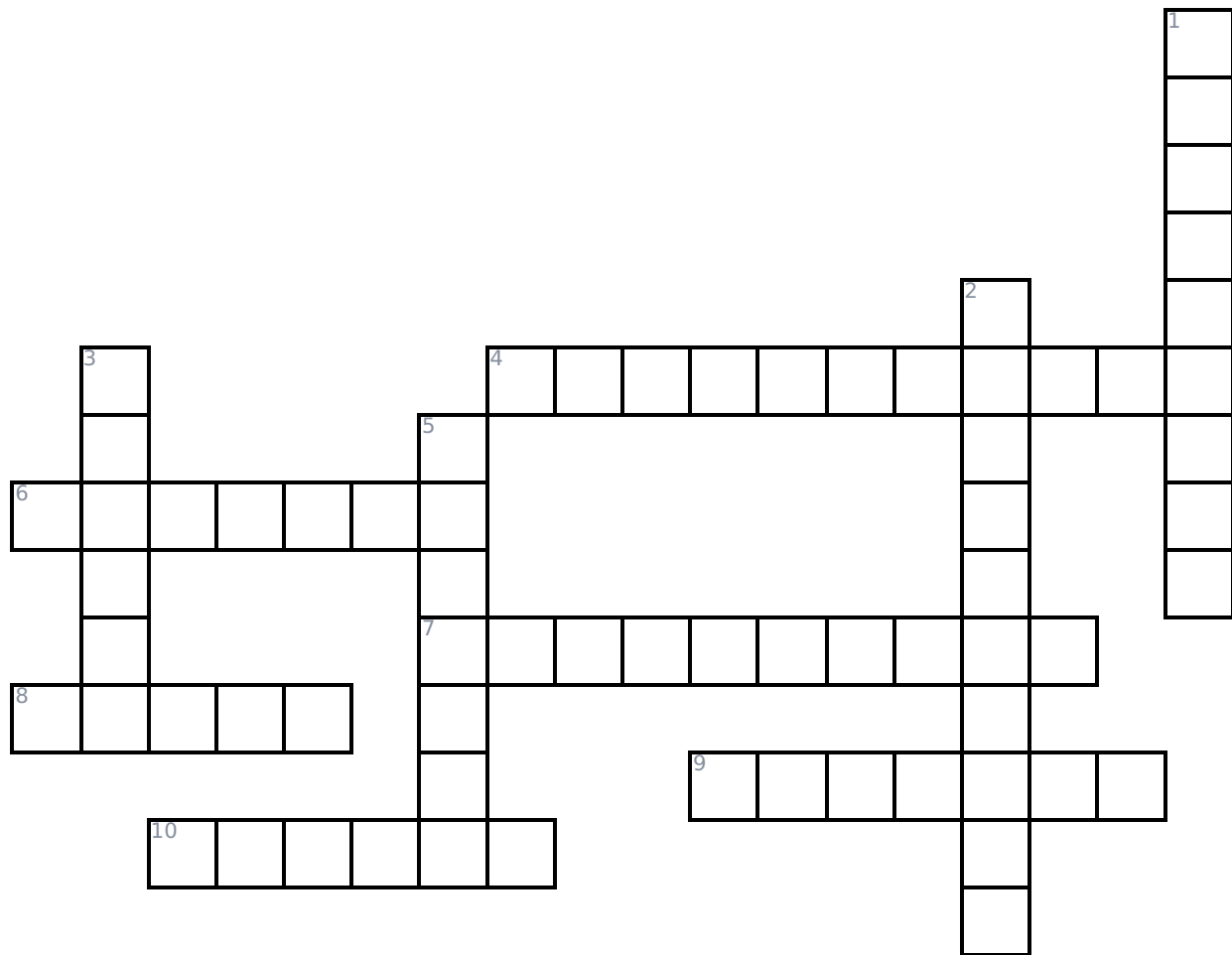


The Boys Who Challenged Hitler: Knud Pedersen and the Churchill Club: Criss Cross
