Chapters 1-2	Student-friendly definition
uneventful (p.2)	with nothing exciting or unusual happening
gargantuan (p.2)	extremely large
apocalypse (p.4)	a situation in which a lot of people die or suffer, and a lot of damage is done
ferocious (p.5)	violent, dangerous, and frightening
inflict (p.9)	to make someone suffer something unpleasant
predicament (p.11)	a difficult or unpleasant situation in which you do not know what to do, or in which you have to make a difficult choice
rhinoceros (p. 19)	a large heavy African or Asian animal with thick skin and either one or two horns on its nose
treacherous (p.19)	ground, roads, weather conditions etc that are treacherous are particularly dangerous because you cannot see the dangers very easily

creamsicle (p. 32)	A flavored popsicle with an ice cream core
formidable (p.36)	very powerful or impressive, and often frightening
rotund (p.38)	having a fat round body – used humorously
cement (p.41)	a thick sticky substance that becomes very hard when it dries and is used for filling holes or sticking things together
sprowl (p. 43)	if an animal prowls, it moves around an area quietly, especially because it is hunting another animal if an animal prowls, it moves around an area quietly, especially because it is hunting another animal
turret (p.72)	the place on a tank from which guns are fired

anarchy (p.76)	a situation in which there is no effective government in a country or no order in an organization or situation
gatorade (p.86)	a type of US drink which is supposed to replace chemicals in the body that are lost when you have been exercising or playing sport
grotesque (p.99)	extremely ugly in a strange or unnatural way
velociraptor (p.100)	Velociraptor is a genus of dromaeosaurid theropod dinosaur
bruising (p.104)	purple or brown marks that you get on your skin where you have fallen, been hit etc

mediation (p. 112)	to try to end a quarrel between two people, groups, countries etc
fetid (p.116)	having a strong bad smell
catapult (p.127)	a large weapon used in former times to throw heavy stones, iron balls etc
moat (p.127)	a deep wide hole, usually filled with water, dug around a castle as a defence
veer (p. 136)	to change direction to change direction
budge (p.146)	to move, or to make someone or something move
ravage (p. 148)	to damage something very badly
damsel in distress (p.156)	a young woman who needs help or protection – used humorously

swell (p.170)	to become larger and rounder than normal – used especially about parts of the body
perch (p.179)	if a bird perches on something, it flies down and sits on it
scuffle (p. 180)	a short fight that is not very violent

vendetta (p.181)	a situation in which one person or group tries for a long time to harm another person
concoct (p.186)	to make something, especially food or drink, by mixing different things, especially things that are not usually combined
confiscate (p.189)	to officially take private property away from someone, usually as a punishment

convulsing (p.196)	if your body or a part of it convulses, it moves violently and you are not able to control it
