# **READ ALOUD GUIDE**

Themes: Halloween, Kindness

Book Brief: Among all the mean, cackling witches, one is actually nice! This little witch doesn't like being bad or causing trouble at all.

### **BEFORE READING**

The Cover: Have students make predictions about the story based on the cover.

The Pictures: Take a brief picture walk and ask students what they notice about the littlest witch.

Prior Knowledge: Ask students, "Why is it important to treat people with kindness?" (Optional: Think, Pair, Share)

Vocabulary: Frontload Tier 2 words using the accompanying Vocabulary Guide.

Purpose for Reading: "As we read today, listen and notice how the littlest witch is different than the others."

# **DURING READING**

Check for understanding & make connections:

- Describe some of the ways the littlest witch is helpful.
- What are some ways the witches are mischievous?
- · How do the witches try to make the littlest witch wicked? Does it work? Why or why not.
- · What lesson does the littlest witch end up teaching the other witches?

#### AFTER READING

Our Purpose: The littlest witch shows kindness. Compare and contrast the littlest witch with the other little witches.

Extending Our Thinking: The littlest witch bakes a cake and shows kindness to the children. Using RIF's Recipe Card, have students create their own recipe for being kind. Encourage students to think about ways to show kindness and compassion towards others.

If your students enjoyed this book...

- Encourage them to continue to discuss it and refer to it in other lessons and conversations.
- Let them explore more about the topic by reading other books with similar themes, structure, characters, or content.
