Book Brief: The familiar song gets a new twist in these silly

energetic books.

BEFORE READING

The Cover: Read the title. "This is a book that takes a popular Vocabulary: leaves, sneeze, pumpkin song and gives it a new silly twist around the theme of fall."

The Pictures: Flip through some of the pictures. What do you same ending sound. As we read, listen for the words that see the old lady doing on each page? Why do you think she's rhyme. doing that?

Prior Knowledge: Look at the cover. What are some fall things that the old lady might swallow in this story?

Purpose for Reading: Words rhyme when they have the

DURING READING

Check for understanding & make connections:

- What do you see in this picture?
- Why do you think the old lady swallowed some leaves?
- What do you think she's going to swallow next?
- What could the old lady be building?
- What do you think is going to happen when the old lady sneezes?

AFTER READING

Our Purpose: As a class, make a list of all the words that rhyme from the book. Can you come up with any other rhyming words to go along with the words in the book?

Extending Our Thinking: Create your own "There Was an Old Lady" style book! Come up with a theme or topic and see if you can write rhyming stanzas that go with the book.

If your students enjoyed this book...

- Encourage them to continue to discuss it and refer to it in other lessons and conversations.
- Let them explore more by reading other books such as There Was an Old Lady Who Swallowed a Bat! and There Was an Old Lady Who Swallowed a Frog!
