BEFORE READING


The Cover: Have students make predictions about the story based on the cover.

The Pictures: Take a brief picture walk and ask students what they notice about the book.

Prior Knowledge: Ask students, "What famous women do you know?"

Extend Our Thinking: Using <u>RIF's Writing Template</u>, have students select a woman and describe how their accomplishment paved way for something in your life.
