

Greta and the Giants: Inspired by Greta Thunberg's Stand to Save the World Discussion Guide Grades Pre-K — 2nd

Before Reading: to activate schema, build background knowledge, and set a purpose.

- Utilize <u>this resource</u> from NASA to build background knowledge on climate change for students.
- Considering using this video to explain climate change easier for younger students.
- Introduce your students to Greta Thunberg with this article from National Geographic Kids.
- Have a discussion around what qualities allow for Greta Thunberg to be successful.

During Reading: to engage students, check for understanding, and make connections.

- How might Greta be feeling that the Giants are destroying the forest? Make connections to what you know about Greta Thunberg in real life.
- What predictions do you have about what Greta might do about the Giants?
- Why is Great making signs that say "STOP"?
- How are Greta's actions bringing the community together?

After Reading: to summarize, question, and reflect.

- What character traits allowed for Greta to be successful in stopping the Giants?
- Have you seen similar actions done in your community? How are these actions similar and different to Greta and her actions? (Optional: Think, Pair, Share)
- Use RIF's <u>Historic Figures Activity Guide</u> to think allow students to think deeply about the author's purpose of writing this story.

If your students enjoyed this book...

- Allow them to explore related activities from the <u>American Museum of Natural History</u>.
- Encourage them to continue to discuss it and refer to it in other lessons and conversations.
- Let them explore more about the topic by reading other books with similar themes, structure, characters, or content.
