


Discussion Guide for Families





'Ohana Means Family

Themes: Family, Traditions

Book Brief: Join the family, or ohana, as they farm taro for poi to prepare for a traditional luau celebration with a poetic text in the style of *The* House That Jack Built.

READ ALOUD

Before Reading: Build Background

Ask your child what are their favorite family traditions, foods, customs?

While Reading: Make Connections

- What does 'ohana mean?
- Why does it take time to plant and cultivate the kalo? What is needed for good growth of the plant?

After Reading: Ask Questions

How does the repetition of the words and phrases help you understand the process of the kalo growing and the lu'au traditions?

RELATED ACTIVITIES

If your child enjoyed this book, consider:

- Thinking about a time when you had a large family gathering. What foods and traditions were part of that gathering. Try drawing an illustration of that experience on paper.
- Read more books by Ilima Loomis, such as Ka'imi's First Round-up
