

The Enormous Turnip


READ ALOUD GUIDE

Themes: Family, Gardening, Harvest, Teamwork, Inclusion

Book Brief: An old man's vegetable patch produces a huge surprise.

BEFORE READING

The Cover: Ask students to make a prediction about the story based on the cover.

The Pictures: Flip through some of the pictures. What do you notice?

Prior Knowledge: Ask, "Have you ever been to a farm or planted a fruit or vegetable?"

Vocabulary: Frontload Tier 2 words using the accompanying Vocabulary Guide.

Purpose for Reading: "As we read, think about how the old man worked with the other characters in the story to solve his problem."

DURING READING

Check for understanding and make connections:

- What are some of the things the old man did to take care of his garden?
- Why do you think it was hard to pull the turnip out of the ground?
- How would you have taken the turnip out of the ground?
- How did the old man know the plants were ready to be harvested?

AFTER READING

Our Purpose: How did the old man solve his problem?

Extending Our Thinking: Have students plant their own mini vegetable garden. Students can journal what they did to take care of their plants.

If your students enjoyed this book...

- · Encourage them to continue to discuss it and refer to it in other lessons and conversations.
- Let them explore more by reading other books about teamwork such as <u>The Little Red Hen</u>.
