

TIME TO READ!



Before: Read the title of the story and look at the cover. Ask your child what they think will happen in the story.

During: As you read, ask your child what the brothers are looking for.

After, ask questions:

- Who did Sammy and Sol meet while looking for the babka?
- Who took the babka?
- · What did Sammy and Sol learn?

INTENTIONAL TALK

Print Awareness is when children develop their understanding of letters, words, and how print works. Help your child notice written language both in the books you read and in the world around them. You can increase your child's print awareness by modeling. Start by reading the cover,

reading from left to right, turning pages as you read, and pointing to words as you read. Eventually your child will learn that even though the pictures in the book have important information, you read the printed words.
