READ ALOUD

Before Reading: Build Background

Ask your child what are their favorite colors in the crayon box.

While Reading: Make Connections

- Why was everything so dark & gray in writing & drawing before crayons?
- Why does it take time & experimentation to create an invention? Why do you think so in the case of the crayons that Binney & Smith invented?

After Reading: Ask Questions

How does you think the variety of colors and their names are imagined?
