

The Enormous Turnip

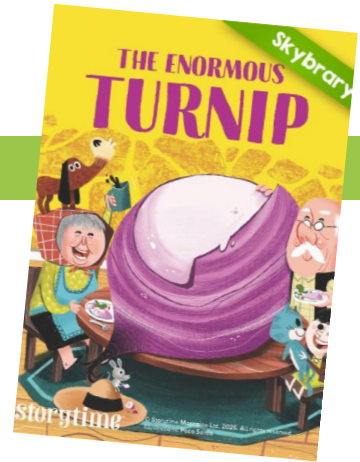
READ ALOUD GUIDE

Themes: Teamwork, Cooperation, Persistence

Book Brief: An old man's vegetable patch produces a huge surprise.

BEFORE READING

The Cover: Ask students to make a prediction about the story based on the cover.

The Pictures: Flip through some of the pictures. What do you notice?

Prior Knowledge: Ask, "Have you ever needed help to do something big or hard? Who helped you?"

Vocabulary: Frontload Tier 2 words using the accompanying [Vocabulary Guide](#).

Purpose for Reading: "As we read, think about how the old man worked with the other characters in the story to solve his problem."

DURING READING

Check for understanding and make connections:

- What does the old man find in his garden?
- Who comes to help pull the turnip?
- What happens each time someone new helps?
- How do they finally get the turnip out?

AFTER READING

Our Purpose: "Who came to help pull the turnip? How did working together help them solve the problem?"

Extending Our Thinking: Ask students, "When have you worked together with others to do something? How did working as a team help?" Encourage students to act out the story in small groups, with each student taking a role (old man, old woman, child, dog, cat, mouse, turnip). Students can practice pulling together and saying the repeated lines. After performing, discuss how it felt to work together as a team to "pull the turnip."

- Encourage them to continue to discuss it and refer to it in other lessons and conversations.
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
