Themes: Global Awareness, Daily Living, Family

Grade Level: Pre-K to 2nd grade

Book Brief: A photographic look at kids' days around the world.

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TIME TO READ!

Before reading, make connections: What is a normal day like in your house? Do you think other kids around the world do

the same types of things you do each day?

While reading, compare and contrast: Which activities are the same as yours? Which are different?

After reading, ask questions:

- ◆ If you could pick another way to get to school, what would it be?
- ◆ Which picture did you like the most?

After reading, explore the pictures:

- ◆ Read the picture information at the end of the book. Find the places on a map or globe.

RELATED ACTIVITIES

OX EYE EGGS (AN INDONESIAN BREAKFAST)

Ingredients: 2 eggs, a little butter, cooked rice

Melt butter in frying pan. Crack eggs into pan and cook until whites are set. Serve eggs over cooked rice. The 2 fried eggs on the rice remind Indonesians of a pair of ox eyes.

OUT AND ABOUT

Help your child practice sequencing by talking about their day. When you get a chance, ask them to tell you about their day—in order! What did they do first thing in the morning? After that? What will they do next? Use plenty of sequence words, like *first*, *last*, *before*, *after*, *later*, or *finally*.

SCHULTÜTE

In Germany, a Schultüte is filled with goodies for the first day of school.

Materials: poster board, tissue paper, glue, stapler, ribbon

1. Make a cone out of the poster board. Glue edges down. Staple edges if needed.
2. Wrap cone in tissue paper. Leave top open.
3. Fill with goodies for school.
4. Tie tissue with ribbon.
